Governor Hogan vetoed SB 639 which prevents arbitrary and capricious dismissal of teachers. This bill ensures that all teachers have a right to a fair hearing of their case. Fortunately, through the hard work of our members, MSEA and Delegate Mary Ann Lisanti, we were able to override Governor Hogan's veto. Please email Delegate Lisanti thanking her for her vote. Please also remember Delegate Lisanti when you vote on election day.

Governor Hogan characterized this SB 639 as, "Watering down educational standards and stymying efforts to provide accountability". The Governor went on to state, that this legislation, which will provide a fair and neutral arbitrator of facts in dismissals, as negatively impacting the local board's ability to respond to employee misconduct. This is just the latest installment in Governor Hogan's attacks on teachers. You can read the entire veto letter <a href="here">here</a>. Governor Hogan has proven to be unsupportive of teachers' concerns and detrimental to our public schools. Remember this on election day.

MSEA was also successful in passing the Fix the Fund Act. The Maryland House of Delegates overwhelmingly passed the Fix the Fund Act by a vote of 130-3, sending the constitutional amendment to general election voters in the fall. The amendment—which passed the Senate 47-0 on March 19—would guarantee that any revenue raised into the Education Trust Fund through casino gaming must be directly sent to schools above and beyond funding through the state's General Fund. That currently amounts to about

\$500 million a year, a big first step to addressing the \$2.9 billion annual funding shortage facing Maryland schools according to a state-commissioned study. It is crucial that we rally all public education supporters to vote for this important constitutional amendment.

## **Know Your Contract**

# ARTICLE XI Sick Leave

11.1 Sick Leave. Sick leave shall be defined as personal illness of the teacher. Teachers shall be granted sick leave at a rate of one (1) day per month during the first two (2) years of service with the Harford County Public Schools. Beginning in the third year of service in Harford County, sick leave shall be granted at a rate of one and a quarter (1.25) days per month of regular employment, the annual total of which shall be available at the beginning of the school year. Accumulation of unused sick leave shall be unlimited. As of June 30, unused personal business leave shall be added to accumulated sick leave. Teachers shall be given a written notice of available sick leave days as of September 1, no later than October 30 of each year.

A teacher is permitted to use up to seven (7) work days of his/her sick leave per year for illness of a member of the teacher's household or the teacher's parent or anyone for whom the teacher is the primary caregiver. When leave is used for illness of a person for whom the teacher is the primary caregiver, other than a member of the teacher's household or the teacher's parent, appropriate documentation will be required.

To receive sick leave the Board is entitled to receive satisfactory proof of illness requiring absence from work.

Under normal circumstances, absent concerns regarding the legitimacy of the claim of illness requiring absence from work Such as cases involving patterns of suspicious absence from work or days of historically dis proportionately high sick leave requests), certification of illness from a medical professional will not be necessary proof of illness for absences of three or fewer consecutive days' duration. The parties understand that the PSLRB has ruled over the objection of the Board that this is a mandatory subject of bargaining. The Board has appealed that decision to the courts. If at the conclusion of litigation, the courts ultimately rule that this is not a mandatory subject of bargaining, then the provisions added to sections 11.1 during the negotiations for FY 17-20 shall no longer be binding upon the parties.
